EQUAL ACCESSIBILITY

Install facilities, such as ramps, handrails, elevators, and ensure sufficient space for accessibility to places.

GOOD ACOUSTICS

Install acoustic solutions to improve speech clarity and decrease distractions, while encourage conversation and collaboration.

NATURAL LIGHT

Use windows, skylights, clear doors, mirrors, reflective surfaces, to promote quantity and distribution of daylight.

COMFORTABLE **TEMPERATURE**

The classroom temperature should be between 20°C and 25 °C to optimise comfort and help children focus.

HIGH AIR QUALITY Use air purifiers, ventilation systems, grow plants that remove toxins, and sort and remove harmful building materials.

VISUAL TRANSPARENCY

Use glass partitions to create visual interconnectedness and aid visual navigation, to make children feel safe and belonged.

ADVANCED EQUIPMENT

Enable children greater accessibilities to content and more streamlined communication, increase engagement, and more personalised experiences.
